

## Workshop on Gender Equality and Gender Mainstreaming Indicators in the Monitoring of Funded Projects

### SCOPE

The GENDER-NET Plus ERA-NET Cofund (2017-2022) emerged from the GENDER-NET ERA-NET research policy initiative, which was active from 2013 to 2016 addressing the challenges faced by European research institutions in achieving gender equality in research and innovation. GENDER-NET Plus is a consortium of 16 committed organisations which join forces to strengthen transnational collaborations between research programme owners and managers, provide support to the promotion of gender equality through institutional change, and instigate the integration of sex and gender analysis into research and funding programmes.

GENDER-NET Plus has recently launched a co-funded call for R&I proposals in order to get interdisciplinary applications exploring gender effects and dimensions in research topics relating to one or more of the following Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): SDG 3 Good health and well-being; SDG 9 Infrastructure, Industrialization and Innovation; and SDG 13 Climate Action.

The **aim** of the workshop is to devise a set of indicators to monitor progress and assess outputs of the co-funded projects, paying particular attention to two main dimensions: gender equality institutional change in Research Performing Organisations (RPOs) and teams; and the Integration of Sex/Gender Analysis into Research content (IGAR). It will also be crucial to explore and identify particular key thematic indicators tailored to monitor IGAR in each one of the 3 above mentioned SDGs main topics. The list of indicators will be constructed by means of a participatory process, building on GENDER-NET's work and on Horizon 2020 requirements in monitoring of funded projects, taking also into account how to improve the monitoring of gender issues for FP9 funded projects.
